

Amethyst Wire Wrapped Bangle Set

Chunky amethyst gemstones and emerald cut Swarovski Crystal beads adorn this stackable set of trendy wire wrapped bangles. Boho chic at its best!

What You'll Need

Artistic Craft Wire, Colored Copper Wire 20 Gauge, 6 Yards, Non-tarnish Brass

Cape Amethyst Gemstone Beads, Rough Nuggets 15-20mm, 4 Pieces, Purple

Instructions

While you're working, your wire might get kinked or bent. You can use nylon-tipped pliers to straighten your wire and remove any kinks as you work.

1. Watch our video on how to make wire wrapped bangles with gemstone focals. You will be using the embellished wire wrapping technique to make these bangles.
2. Based on what you learned in the video, measure one six-foot piece of wire and cut it with flush cutters.
3. Wrap the wire around the bracelet mandrel three times at the desired size, leaving a 9-inch tail on one side and the rest of the wire on the other side. Carefully hold your wire loops together and slide the bracelet off of the mandrel.
4. Use your flat nose pliers to bend your shorter wire tail up at a 90-degree angle. Then, coil it tightly around the bracelet base three times, ending with the

wire sticking straight up again.

5. Slide on one Swarovski emerald cut bead. Bend the wire down so the bead lays flat against the bracelet. Then wrap the wire twice around the bangle, securing the bead to the bracelet.

6. Now, wrap the remaining length of your wire tail around the crystal bead, stabilizing it from beneath. Wrap the wire twice around, ending on the side with two coils. Secure the wire to the base with two more snug coils, then clip off the excess wire with flush cutters. Use a wire rounder to smooth the tip of the wire, then use flat nose pliers to tuck it neatly against the base.

7. You'll be using your longer wire tail for the remaining two beads. Visually decide where you want to place your first amethyst nugget bead and move to that spot. Repeat steps 4-6 with the first nugget bead, but don't clip off the rest of your wire tail after wrapping the bead -- you will need it for the second gemstone bead.

8. Repeat steps 4-6 with your second amethyst nugget bead. After you finish coiling the wire, clip off the excess wire with flush cutters, smooth the tip of the wire and flatten it to the base of the bracelet.

9. You will repeat these instructions twice more to create the other two bangles in this set. Enjoy!
