

Mens Beaded Bracelet

This basic beadwoven bracelet has a masculine feel, in matte beads with an antiqued pewter clasp. Or change it up and

make a feminine version too!

What You'll Need

Miyuki Delica Seed Beads 11/0 'Matte Black Opaque' DB310 7.2 Grams

SKU: DB-310

Project uses 2 tubes



Fireline Braided Beading Thread .006 In. - Smoke Grey - 15 Yards

SKU: XCR-1285 Project uses 1 spool



TierraCast Antiqued Lead-Free Pewter E Hook Clasp 18.5x27.5mm (1)

SKU: FCL-9270

Project uses 1 piece



Recommended Tools:

[XTL-3006] Beadsmith English Beading Needles Size 12 (4 Needles), [XTL-5700] Fiskars 5 Precision Tip Scissors - Super Sharp, [XTL-0106] BeadSmith Cordless Thread Zap II Thread Burner Tool





Instructions

Standard sizes for mens bracelets are generally between 8" and 8 1/2".

- 1. Before you begin, watch the instructional video: How to do Flat Even Count Peyote.
- 2. Using matte black 11/0 Delicas, weave a strip of flat even count peyote that is 14 beads wide. Leave an 8" tail at the beginning of your work.
- 3. Weave the strip 3/4" longer than your desired finished bracelet measurement. I made my bracelet 8" long, so my woven piece was 8 3/4" long. Do not tie off your thread when you've reached the desired length.
- 4. Attach one end of your beadwork to the closed end of an antiqued pewter "E" hook clasp using the same technique demonstrated in this video, folding over about 1/2" of your work.



- 5. On the other end of your work, fold over about 1/2" of the beading and stitch it down the same way as you did the other side, just without the hook.
- 6. Tie off and weave in your threads.
- 7. To fasten, slide the open part of the "E" hook into the free end of the beading where you've formed a loop with the foldover.
