


## **The Mucha Necklace**

This simple to make statement piece is named in honor of one of the masters of Art Nouveau: Alphonse Mucha.



## **Instructions:**

- 1. Begin by cutting two lengths of chain at approximately eight and a half inches long each. Note: The total length of the necklace is twenty one inches. You may shorten or lengthen your chain depending on what length you would like your necklace to be.
- 2. Open both of the larger jump rings and add them to the last link of each piece of chain.
- 3. Now thread the jump rings through the two outermost loops in the design of the brass art nouveau stamping. Close jump rings once again.
- 4. Open the small jump ring and use it to connect the lobster clasp to the last link of one of the pieces of chain.

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
