Instructions

This finished necklace is 18 inches in length. For a longer or shorter necklace adjust the length of the chain accordingly.

- 1. Begin by cutting two circles of the faux leather, with 1.5" diameter. You can use a household item such as a bottle to trace on the back of the faux leather.
- 2. Take one faux leather circle and center the compass decorivet. Cut two tiny holes with your flush cutters to set it down into. Take your chain nose pliers and fold the ends down to secure this piece.



- 3. Place the two faux leather circles back to back, with the compass correctly oriented. Take the chain and place the center at the bottom of the compass piece so that it wraps around the circle and the ends are even.
- 4. Thread your needle with 3 feet of Nymo. Tie a knot about 1 inch from one the end. Thread through the backside of one piece of faux leather. Sandwich the pieces together, so that the thread is "trapped" inside the pieces. Create a whip stitch edge catching the chain link. Sew back down into the faux leather and back up for your second stitch. A similar technique to this can be seen in our video: How to Add Chain to Peyote Bead Weaving.
- 5. Continue to stitch around the circle. When you come to the north side, you will cross over the chains and catch two links (a front and back link) in the whip stitch. You will do this for two links for stability. Then move on around the circle with picking up the other side of the chain.
- 6. Once you have returned to the start, tie off and weave in your thread.
- 7. To complete the necklace, move to one end of the chain and open one jump ring, attach it to the last link and to one lobster clasp. Close the jump ring.
- 8. On the other end, open one jump ring and attach it to the last link. Close the jump ring.
