Project R107

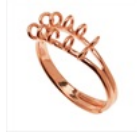
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Piles upon piles of periwinkle and copper beads are clustered upon this luscious ring. It is easy to make and very impressive looking.



What You'll Need

Copper Plated Ten-Loop Beading Rings Adjustable (x4)



SKU: JR-1052

Project uses 1 piece

Copper Head Pins 24 Gauge 1.5 Inches (50 Head Pins)



SKU: FHP-1038

Project uses 30 pieces

Czech Seed Beads Mix 11/0 Copper Supra Metallic (1 Hank)



SKU: BCS-1162

Project uses 30 pieces

Czech Seed Beads 6/0 Light Copper Supra Metallic (1 Ounce)



SKU: BCS-6162

Project uses 10 pieces

Czech Pressed Glass Beads 6 x 2mm Rondelle Spacers Light Blue Opal (25)

Project uses 20 pieces

Instructions:

1. Onto ten headpins, thread an 11/0 seed bead and a 6/0 seed bead. Make a simple loop on the end of each headpin and trim off excess wire.
2. Onto twenty headpins, thread an 11/0 seed bead and a light blue Czech glass rondelle. Make a simple loop on the end of each headpin and trim off excess wire.
3. Open each of the loops, the same way you would open a jump ring.
4. Onto each of the ten loops on the ring, thread two of the glass bead dangles and one seed bead dangle.
5. Close each of the dangles loops.
